"Shortly after the assassination of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Black Catholic priests, women religious, religious brothers, and laypeople in the U.S. inaugurated the Black Catholic Movement, a period of prolific theological, liturgical, and institutional development. While it succeeded in developing Black Catholic theology and liturgical inculturation, the Movement's most significant project--the creation of an African American ordinariate, an ecclesial jurisdiction independent of the US Catholic bishops--failed to come to fruition. This lecture examines how the leaders of the Black Catholic Movement, drawing from the teaching of the Second Vatican Council (1962– 1965), engaged in a struggle to create their own selfdetermining ecclesial structures."
